STATEMENT ON LOCAL CONTROL OF 5G IMPLEMENTATION

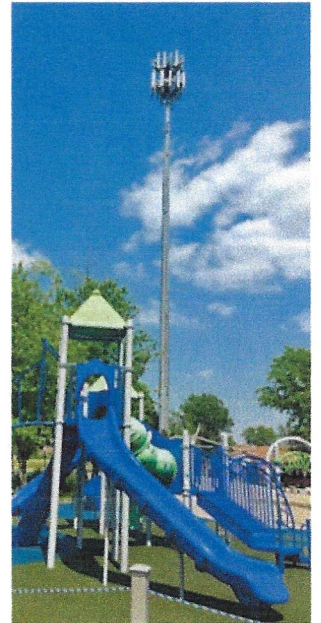
“Our founding principles say that we have a right to self-govern. We want to be safe and free in our homes. But many of these 5G wireless decisions were taken out of our hands.” - Deanne Mazzochi, State Representative – 47th District

As 5G is being implemented across the country, many people still have valid concerns over the safety and use of such a system. The installation of 5G towers would put them near people’s homes without their consent and regardless of their safety. The radiation put off by the towers requires that only certified FCC officials approach within 3 ft of the equipment. The problem is that restriction does nothing to address the long-term exposure to the radiation in the vicinity of the towers, often within distance to where children play.

The 5G spectrum includes the 95 GHz band, which the US military also uses for the “Active Denial System”. This system disperses crowds by heating up their skin! While the towers certainly are not as powerful as such a system, it’s a good demonstration of why We the People need to have a voice in the rollout of this new communications system.

The Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act (SB1451, 100th General Assembly) did nothing to address the concerns of the people who must live around these towers. This Act will sunset in June 2021, which makes this coming election even more important for those who are concerned about this development. If you want input and control of your community living standards, you need to elect people who are willing to listen to We the People.

I am of the firm conviction that nothing should be pushed over the concerns of the people. If we value our republic, we must listen to the people and address their concerns before moving forward with such programs.
